Children's Ministries: Babies are always welcome in the Sanctuary during worship. We also have a nursery (accessible through the breezeway in the back of the Sanctuary). First Church offers child care for ages 3 months to 3 years with professional nursery staff on Sundays 9:45am-11:45am. Sunday School classes are known as "Disciple Road" (Pre-K through 4th grade) and "Middle Road" (5th grade and up). We also have a children's choir. We have a new **hearing assist system** available. 


#### **Environmental Justice Team**



#### SUSTAINABLE FAIRFIELD TASK FORCE



Sustainable Fairfield Task Force has received a Community Partnership Initiative grant through Energize CT to support a campaign to encourage Income Eligible (i.e., low or fixed income) households to have home energy assessments and consider switching to heat pumps. The Home Energy Solution - Income Eligible program is available at no cost for qualifying customers (the same general program is available to non-Income Eligible households but requires a \$75 co-pay).

The value of services provided is estimated to be about \$850 and annual savings are about \$180 for the average home.

As part of this program, participating churches will receive a \$25 referral fee for any member that goes through with an assessment. Please mention First Church when you call New England Smart Energy for an appointment at 203-292-8088
